heart strings FAII 2018 **SCHOOL IS IN SESSION!** How to Help Students Cope

ow that the dust has settled, and school has started back up again, the Children's Bereavement Center is here to give you some helpful ways to support the students in your life that may be grieving the death of a loved one. Grief can present itself in several different ways, all of which can affect a child's concentration, their attendance, increase their anger and present other physical symptoms (headaches, stomachaches, tiredness, etc.).

Before sending your child back to school, know that grieving children/teens need support from caring adults and they need to be reassured their feelings and thoughts are normal and that you are there for them. Here are some helpful hints to help support your child:

- Talk to the child/teen to determine what he/she wants others to know about his/her situation.
- Help the child/teen with words to use when others ask questions they do not want to answer.

- Keep things as "normal" as possible. (We know, easier said than done.)
- Create a plan and a signal with your child/ teen that allows him/her to leave the classroom or situation if needed. Please cover all plans with your child's teacher to make sure everyone is on the same page.
- Establish a safe, quiet alternative to the classroom. Talk to the librarian, the nurse or the school counselor and see if you can arrange a "safe place" for them to go and take a moment to themselves. Again, talk to the appropriate school officials so everyone is on the same page.

The most important thing to remember is that everyone experiences loss differently and that grief is a natural response to loss. If you begin to see red flags regarding your child/teen, act, don't wait. Red flag behaviors are, but not limited to: dramatic changes in personality or attitude, fighting/legal troubles, isolation from family and/or friends, suicidal thoughts, or academic failure/over-achievement.
