he Children's Bereavement Center is happy to announce another successful summer at Hermann Sons Life Camp in Comfort, Texas. The Center hosted over 80 kids, ages 6-17, from San Antonio and the surrounding areas, at a 3-day, 2-night grief camp. Campers played and had fun making new friends with other children who have experienced a similar loss. These campers engaged in recreational and expressive art activities to help process the feelings of grief. Activities included journaling, dramatic play, music and art.



Many of the children who attend Hermann Sons Life Camp have experienced a loss of a parent or a close family member (grandparent/aunt/uncle). Since



the death loss, most of these children have seen a change in residency, as well as a change in school so they find it nice to get away from the everyday things. At Hermann Sons Life Camp, campers found it helpful to talk in sharing circles with other children who have also lost someone close. Campers also reported that the breathing exercises



taught in the sharing circles were helpful and will be used outside of the camp setting.

Overall, children were given a safe space to explore their grief and learned it is okay talk about their experience with others. While the Board of Directors has been busy behind-the-scenes, planning for and working on the agency's future, staff and volunteers continued to provide program services and prepare for the upcoming school year - customarily a very busy time for the Center. In fact, demand for the Center's services has increased so much that we are now open seven days per week - to host peer support groups and provide counseling. We are fortunate to have dedicated staff and volunteers that make this possible. In addition, our teams at Paloma Place in Wilson County and CBC-RGV in the Valley have also been serving record numbers of children and families this Summer.

Though it's still hitting 100° every day, Fall is just around the corner (can you smell the pumpkin spice lattes?) and school is already in full swing, which means the Center is humming with activity! This year we are working with Family Service Association to provide our services to students on school campuses across the city - a collaboration funded by United Way of San Antonio & Bexar County. This unique partnership will take us into five school districts this year and expands our effort to make grief support services easy for students to access - at school where they spend their days. We are incredibly proud of this schoolbased initiative and grateful for the

opportunity to extend our services to more grieving children and youth.

In preparation for the new school year, we've also just welcomed 12 new interns to the CBCST team and will add 5-6 Pet Therapy teams to assist with peer support groups for Sibling Loss, Beyond Self Hurt, Beyond Violence and the new Parent Loss group on Saturdays. We look forward to the healing support they will provide our families this semester.

Finally, as I write this, we are shadowed by the tragedies that recently took place in Midland, Odessa, Gilroy, El Paso and Dayton. There are no words to express our sadness for the families affected by these senseless acts of violence and hate. Our hearts are with every person who lost a loved one. Please know that CBCST is supporting these communities in any way possible. Our team sent a care package with words of sympathy and support accompanied by a supply of special grief workbooks in both English and Spanish to our friends at Children's Grief Center in El Paso. We remain on-call for whatever they need. Meanwhile, our Center in the Rio Grande Valley has initiated a special peer

support group and counseling services for unaccompanied immigrant children who have lost loves ones and are now housed in detention centers along that area of the Texas-Mexico border. Our days are full.

At the core of Kathleen's approach as


